



# Policing and Mental Illness in Victoria: Data in Search of a Solution.

Professor Ogloff received his Ph.D. in psychology and his Juris Doctor in law, with distinction, from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. He is a registered psychologist in Victoria and is a Fellow of the Canadian Psychological Association, the American Psychological Association, and the Australian Psychological Society. He is the Foundation Professor of Clinical Forensic Psychology at Monash University and Director of the Centre for Forensic Behavioural Science. He is also Director of Psychological Services at the Victorian Institute of Forensic Mental Health (Forensicare). He is the Coordinator of the Clinical Forensic specialisation of the Doctor of Psychology course at Monash University. Prior to these appointments, Professor Ogloff was the University Endowed Professor of Law and Forensic Psychology at Simon Fraser University in Canada. While there, he developed and directed the Program in Law and Forensic Psychology. Professor Ogloff also served as the Director of Mental Health Services for the Ministry of Attorney General, Corrections Branch in British Columbia. He also held appointments as Adjunct Professor of Law at the University of British Columbia and Adjunct Professor of Psychology at the University of Manitoba.

Professor Ogloff is a clinical forensic psychologist. He has worked in the field of psychology in a variety of clinical and forensic settings, including jails, prisons, forensic psychiatric clinic and hospitals, since 1984. His work has included the assessment of professionals who have faced difficulties with registration boards and professional bodies (e.g., medical practitioners, legal practitioners, psychologists). Professor Ogloff has given expert evidence in courts in Australia, Indonesia, Canada, and the United States. Professor Ogloff regularly consults to the Victoria Police. He currently serves on the Corrections Health Board in Victoria and on the Australian Forensic Reference Group. Professor Ogloff has published 12 books and more than 190 scholarly articles and book chapters.
