Nicola Lautenschlager is an academic old age psychiatrist who received her undergraduate and postgraduate training, including an MD in 1994, at the Technical University in Munich, Germany. In 1995 she spent one year as a postdoc fellow at Boston University in the United States. From October 2000 to June 2008 NL worked at the University of Western Australia in Perth, Australia where her last position was Professor in Old Age Psychiatry and Deputy Head of School.

In July 2008 she took up the position of University of Melbourne Professor & Chair of Old Age Psychiatry at the Department of Psychiatry, where she is also Head of the Academic Unit for Psychiatry of Old Age. Nicola is the Director of the St. Vincent's Health Aged Psychiatry Service at St. George's Hospital in Kew. Her current research focus is early diagnosis of cognitive impairment and intervention trials for older adults to improve mental health outcomes.
